eneva Bond is an award winning canoe see paddler. She is the granddaughter of Carl and Carol Bond and paddles out of the Maskwa Aquatic Club in Halifax.

In August 2021 Geneva won the under-18 women's C-1 500-metre race beating out Ava Carew of the Senobe Aquatic Club in Dartmouth. With this win she was able to take part in the world championships in Portugal joining fourteen other Nova Scotia paddlers named to Canada's Junior Men's/Women's and Under-23 teams.

Geneva hasn't just waltzed her way into the sport; she has been training for it since

she was a pre-teen. She loves the sport of canoe paddling but it takes the dedication of training 6 days a week, many hours a day and month long training camps in Florida and Germany to achieve the awards she has earned.

Canoe sprint racing takes place on a flatwater course and the paddler competes in a striding position using a single-blade paddle. Competitive canoe sprint racing is an old sport founded in England in 1869 and made its debut at the Olympic Games in Berlin in 1936. Twelve years later the first women's race was at the London Olympic games.

Geneva has achieved gold medals at Nationals and set new Atlantic and National records while representing Canada in the C1 500m race at Junior World Championship in Portugal last fall. She placed fourth just missing the podium by mere seconds. Her accomplishments were recognized at the Nova Scotia **Support4Sport** where she was awarded Junior Female Athlete of the Year for Canoe Kayak.

Geneva is a strong competitor not just in paddling but other sports as well. Before she was training for canoe races she was taking Taekwon-Do. In 2015 Geneva received a black belt. She competed in Quebec and went on to Vancouver winning a gold medal in both places. Over the years she has won many medals and since she is now going in another direction she told her grandmother that she "went out with a bang".

Currently Geneva is concentrating on her studies at Acadia University. Taking mechancial engineering she finished

her first year on the Dean's List.

Her proud grandmother says, "She is one amazing girl" and we think so too. *Carol Bond & Sharon Lake*

A Gift For The Hall

ometime ago we received from Catherine Stewart a gift of an oak table and two benches (heavy as lead) which were made by E.A.

Edward Alonzo Stewart was born January 1903 to Charles and Bessie (Atwell) Stewart in Black River and he died in 1984 at 81 years of age. He was employed by the Nova Scotia Light and Power Co. Ltd. as hydro superintendent. After retirement he became well-known for his craft and gunsmithing skills. He was involved in many clubs, The Rotary Club, The Annapolis Valley Gun Club, director of the VON and Commissioner of the social assistance appeal board among a few.

In 2021 Catherine sent a small brass plaque to be affixed to the table, with the following inscribed on the plaque :

Handcrafted by E. A. Stewart.

Catherine goes on to write the following about Ed Stewart:

" [He] could make anything from a gun (from scratch) to a great pot of beans. He never wasted anything. So this table and benches were made from the Oak Water Tunnel ending at Hell's Gate.

He told stories of himself and his siblings Don, Shirley & Graeme, who coasted in hand-made go-carts to school, down "Vesuvius" and on Saturday he ran to Wolfville to get 5¢ worth of nails for building anything.

He loved the community of Black River and once was heard to say at a family gathering "my what a lot of good looking people!"

Ed Stewart really knew how to live and participate. His grandchildren are proud to be part of him. Kennedy is Mayor of Vancouver at present and hopes to serve another term. Evan works with treaties and Aboriginal Land Claims and is a Registered Professional Forester (RPF) in Vancouver. Julia is the director of the Public Library in Fredericton, NB."

We were very pleased to be gifted the table and benches because of who made it and his ties with the history of our area. It is a fine table and we use it all the time inside the Hall. Thanks to Catherine for the gift.
