

My Dad - Lester Dimock McLearn

ust before I woke up this morning, I was having a very nice dream about my Dad's home place in South Rawdon. My Uncle Clyde lived there until about ten years ago, and he only left because of health issues. It's funny how, in a dream, one can see the exact details of the way things used to be. The old garage where Uncle Clyde kept his lawn tractor and the old Farmall Tractor out back of that under a lean to. The spot where the ice house used to be. The white rock on the lawn, wooden creatures, painted up, nailed to trees and on the

lawn. The small garage with the old GMC in it. And the lake - a small piece of what everyone wishes they could have on their property. I have a lot of great memories there with my wife and sons.

It just so happens, that twelve years ago today my Dad passed away. I remember Dad



telling me about his days on the home place, being raised without his father after he was nine years old. Dad would talk about the chores that had to be done morning and night. The gathering of maple sap was a must because sugar was rationed in the war years. My Dad and my Uncle Duncan were great pals and a crosscut saw team in the winters. Dad told me many times the thousands of feet of timber they had cut together. No chainsaw involved then. Lots of stories that I would love to hear again.

The year of 1976 I would have been fifteen years old in April. Dad would let me take the car out to Sunken Lake to swim, and to the farm to pick up milk. But I was doing this at twelve as well. During the ground hog day storm in February we lost the old barn. Levy's lost a silo. Dad started to clean up the fallen barn, and salvage the lumber. In the Spring, he started the prep work for a new garage/barn which was in operation by 1977.

The last year of Dad's life is extremely tough on my memory today. I worked shift work - once working eight twelve hour night shifts in a row. My head felt like a pumpkin that had fallen off a moving truck. Dad's health was failing, and my patience was probably short. Dad loved to talk, and I sure wish that I could have been there more for him. I always spell Dad with a capital "D". He deserves it. I loved my Dad dearly, even though at times I didn't show it. I'm not a religious person, but I do know for a fact, that wherever my Dad is, if there is a Massey Harris and a Jonsered chainsaw handy, there is a windrow of pulp or stud wood down and he is waiting for me to help him get it to the field.
