
How to Move a Stove



Nate's mother, Lexie, had got a new kitchen range, so the old one needed to be removed. Nate was given the job and since I was with him at the time, I too got involved. That old cast iron wood stove was one heavy piece of equipment, I can tell you. With some grunting and groaning, we managed to get it out of the kitchen, through the back porch and onto the tailgate of the half ton truck backed up to the door without taking the paint off door frames and keeping it off both the floor and our toes. We then pushed and shoved and "walked" it until it sat solidly on the truck bed.

In the days before bi-weekly garbage pick-up, spring clean-up or much in the way of environmentally sound practices, every household had a dump down in the pasture. On the other hand, people threw away a fraction of what gets put curbside nowadays, and when it was finally discarded, there was no use left in things as a rule. One still comes across old homesteads which boast their own rusting family histories. The stove in question was condemned to such a fate.


